But when our children die, the anxiety of that possibility pales against the sole wrenching horror of the reality. At first we freeze in time as our focus is on the primal... breathe, drink water. After the initial shock has ceased to control our every moment, we seek answers. Can I get through this? Do I want to get through this? How have others managed to continue living after their child has died? I have disconnected from my friends and even my family. I don't want to go forward... the pain is too intense. Death would be a mercy. Life is no Now our lives are forever enlonger a joy. My heart is broken. I will never see my child again.

If we are fortunate enough to find a Compassionate Friends group, we meet people who have taken this nightmare journey... and survived. Our first meeting is the

most difficult... at my first meeting the only word I could say was my son's name. Later, we tell our story to those who have experienced the death of their child and find cathartic. If we persevere and continue to attend meetings, get to know other parents, participate in the group discussions, cry with others and smile
